Issue No. 3 of this marvelous tome. As requested, dated, and here are the previous issue dates: #1-4/12; #2-5/29.

Primary purpose of this one is to whet your appetite. One of our number attended the Consumer Electronics Show in Chicago last week & saw the Tiny BASIC in operation. I have seen a copy of the Instruction Book. So there is hardware, and working. Latest delivery dates are July, hopefully 'early' (says JS&A). Full keyboard February. Note that in order to store the programs that you will write, you need the "Audio Cassette Interface", a \$50 gadget that plugs into controller #4 slot and takes power from the 3-pin connector. This uses Kansas City Standards, and works at a 300 baud figure. (This connector is also for the future light pen.)

The Manual is very sketchy on the Cassette Interface. One page tells you of the controls (Save, etc) and that's it. Iguess that this device is a necessity with the Add-On.

also control words for colors(background & forground), cursor control, and music. Yes, the TBASIC will give you 3 octaves, sharps&flats. Say, someone will have to rig up an electronic organ keyboard to interface directly with the computer.

NCE literature also indicates commands: FREEZE, ABSOLUTE, LET, & REMARK that I didn't note in the manual.

Well, all this indicates that we should have some fun once we have the tools.
